Mayor and Council Minutes
February 28, 2022

The City of Byron Mayor and Council met in special session in the Executive Conference Room at the Municipal Complex. Mayor Michael Chidester, Council Members Michael Chumbley, James Richardson, Rusty Adams, Chris Hodges, and Alan Dorsey were in attendance. City employees that attended were City Clerk Telina Allred, City Administrator Tiffany Sandefur and Public Works Director Tiffany Bibb. County Commissioners Martin Moseley and Roy Lewis attended the meeting as did a representative from the Leader Tribune.

Mayor Chidester called the meeting to order at 8:00am.

BONDS ISSUING: Mayor Chidester made sure that everyone had a chance to view the new numbers that were sent out regarding the issuance of bonds if approved. Mr. Moseley and Mr. Lewis spoke on the need to have Byron go in on the bonds as it seems to be the best option to complete the many project needs for all concerned. Mr. Moseley said the Raymond James bond rating is AA3. Council member Chumbley spoke on being good stewards with the taxpayer's money to which all agreed. Ms. Sandefur stated her priority to get a traffic light at Hwy 49 and Cane River Storage Drive where Dunkin is located. Council member Chris Hodges stated the importance of these projects to make it safer for citizens and cutting down on accidents. Motion made by Chris Hodges, seconded by Alan Dorsey to approve the issuance of bonds regarding the TSPLOST. Unanimous.
