City of Byron Mayor and Council Minutes July 14, 2025

The City of Byron Mayor and Council met in regular session in the Council Chambers of the Municipal Complex. Mayor Michael Chidester and Council Members Michael Chumbley, James Richardson, Rusty Adams, Chris Hodges, and Alan Dorsey were in attendance. City employees that attended were City Administrator Tiffany Sandefur, Assistant to the City Administrator Melanie Bickford, City Clerk Telina Allred, Deputy Clerk Elissa Lee, Director of Public Works Tiffany Bibb, Captain Bryan Hunter, Fire Chief Josh Riley. City Attorney Brian Causey attended the meeting as did four (4) visitors. A representative from the Byron Buzz attended the meeting.

Mayor Michael Chidester called the meeting to order at 6:00pm, asked James Richardson to give the invocation, and led the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance.

<u>AGENDA AMENDED</u>: Mayor Chidester asked that the agenda be amended to remove items 3, 4, and 14. To add as a new item (4) adding the opening of CDs for the City of Byron.

<u>APPROVAL OF MINUTES</u>: Motion made by Michael Chumbley, seconded by Alan Dorsey to approve the minutes of the Mayor and Council Meetings held on June 9, 2025. Unanimous.

<u>CITIZEN TIME TO ADDRESS COUNCIL</u>: Ms. Kimberly Jump addressed the Mayor and Council regarding her request for speed bumps on Murdock Lane and Academy Street. Mayor Chidester asked for needed citizen engagement to record or submit tag pictures and report these speeders to the Police Department to help curtail them. Ms. Jump's argument is that it tends to happen when she is busy with the grandkids or late at night.

Willa Dean Barbor spoke about the extensive water that pours through her lot and under her home on Boy Scout Road after a rain. She requested a larger grate to drain water so that she doesn't have to constantly clean it out during a rain event. She states that since the road was built up, she has been catching water from Hamlin Street, Canady Street, and Boy Scout Road. She is a senior citizen and is asking for any help she can get. Mayor Chidester stated that the Director of Public Works is listening to her requests and will be following up with her.

Ms. Tabitha Barnes addressed the Mayor and Council about storm water flooding her driveway during a rain event. A resident of Alpine Drive for over 20 years and the flooding is about to take out her retaining walls and she fears she will one day come home and be unable to get to her home because of the water. Mayor Chidester stated that the city has her as a priority 3 right now with engineers working on several issues for Byron as well. He also said that the city is looking into

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new ways to fund the water problem she speaks of. Ms. Bibb said she would be out in the next few days with someone to look into the issue at her residence.

<u>VEHICLE REPLACEMENT RATIFICATION</u>: Motion made by James Richardson, seconded by Rusty Adams to ratify the approval from the June Committee Meeting to replace a totaled Police vehicle. Item required a full vote of Council. Unanimous.

<u>COVENANT TO ANNEX</u>: Motion made by Chris Hodges, seconded by Alan Dorsey to approve a covenant to annex per request of Jeffrey L. and Linda S. Morrow regarding property located at 2080 Moseley Road; tax map 045 045 for the purpose of acquiring water service. Unanimous.

<u>COVENANT TO ANNEX</u>: Motion made by Chris Hodges, seconded by Rusty Adams to approve a covenant to annex per request of David Lugo Ramos regarding property located at 482 Burnett Road; tax map 045 066 B for the purpose of acquiring water service. Unanimous.
